

We are waiting for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed.

Mark 13:37

On the first Sunday of Advent a cry goes out to all the people of God: you must wake up now and **Stay Awake!** The time has come! Advent is the great season of waiting for the coming of the Lord Jesus at Christmas and for His coming at the end of time. Today's Collect reminds us that 'we must be resolved to run forth to meet Christ'. Advent is thus a time of anticipation, waiting, hope, listening and watchfulness that calls us to return to God and believe in His faithfulness and love and who will never give up on us for

Lord, you are our Father; we the clay, you the potter, we are all the work of your hand.

Isaiah 63:

Advent offers us both assurance and challenge. We are assured of the Lord's coming but also challenged to consider how we prepare for the Lord's coming. What are we waiting for? Are we living day-to-day in such a way that we are ready when He comes?
