

## Through its "Going Forth" out of itself, the Congregation is born again.

Since its origin, the Congregation of the Daughters of Wisdom has lived the movement of "going forth", which required adjustments to the often unexpected projects of . Surely, throughout history, "the hand of God" has never ceased to accompany the Congregation.

Marie-Louise, first Daughter of Wisdom, was called by Wisdom to leave her native town of Poitiers for St Laurent in Vendée, an unknown land for her. Then, always moving forth, the Daughters of Wisdom spread across France, then beyond the borders to Belgium and into distant lands: Haiti, Canada, Colombia ...etc.

The movement of "going forth again and again" which characterized the history of the Daughters of Wisdom was particularly celebrated in 2020 with the Tercentenary of the arrival of Marie-Louise in St Laurent in the unprecedented context of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The current health crisis gives us the opportunity to reinvent new ways to live the orientation of the General Chapter 2018. The movement of reconfiguration and interculturality which leads us outward has slowed down with covid-19. However, the orientation of the Congregation carries an inner inspiration which cannot stop because "love is always a going out of oneself towards the other" [1]. Is this not the meaning of love without borders?

Covid-19 has upset the planning of the General Council for the implementation of the "Love without borders" orientation. But it does not take away from us the capacity to love "with a heart without fear and without borders" [2], even if we have to live in confinement.

Thus, "from going forth to going forth", the life and mission of the Congregation continues as can be observed by reading the first issue of the year 2021 of the Sagesse International Bulletin.

On Wednesday October 7th , 2020, 3 pre-novices entered the novitiate during a Eucharistic celebration presided by Father Adolphe smm. Also, the entry to the pre-novitiate took place. The Sisters of the three communities of Antananarivo joined the formation community to participate.

In his address to the novices and the pre-novices, Father Adolphe exhorted them to take advantage of the time of formation which is a time of grace and to welcome it with all its requirements, as a means of growth. He invited them to actively participate in their formation as the first agent of their formation, with an open attitude. The Father blessed the signs of the stage of formation that would subsequently be offered to novices and pre-novices after their commitment by the Provincial. Each novice presented her symbol which reflects her journey: a young plant, a bouquet of flowers and a notebook.

Sister Symphorose, Provincial Leader, addressed words of encouragement and congratulations to the novices and pre-novices for daring to go out into the open sea to respond to the call of Christ Wisdom. She then thanked the 4 sisters appointed as formators and assistants for their "yes" in assuming this responsibility so delicate and difficult. She encouraged them to intensify collaboration among themselves for the success of their mission.

Sister Berthe-Léa is the one in charge of the novitiate and Sister Agathe, her assistant. Sister Florentine, the one responsible for the pre-novitiate and Sister Marie Yolande, her assistant. The 4 formators (are) committed themselves to accomplishing the mission entrusted to them. After the mass, there was the sharing of the meal in an atmosphere of joy manifested by songs and dancing.

# A Novitiate "à la Marie-Louise"

#### Sign of the times

The consequences of the COVID 19 pandemic have disrupted the proper functioning of the formation of novices at the Francophone Novitiate in Clamart. The General Council had to take an appropriate decision, that of organizing the novitiates in the Entities in order to allow the continuity of formation. I welcomed this decision by giving meaning from the celebration experienced in 2020, the 300th anniversary of the arrival of Marie Louise de Jesus in Saint Laurent. I read in the decision of the General Council a sign of the times, as Mother Marie-Louise had done when she went to implant Wisdom in Saint Laurent. I was happy to return to Congo to provide this service of formation to the novices in our Delegation.



#### As in Saint-Laurent

On October 7, 2020, 4 pre-novices entered the novitiate and 6 aspirants also entered the pre-novitiate. The conditions of welcome of novices are modest and we give meaning to them by thinking of the beginning of the foundation in Saint Laurent. However, we realize that we are better equipped than this first community.

#### Significant event

During ten years, there have been no entry into the novitiate in Congo, since the novices left for Clamart. The entry of this year was a milestone for the Entity. The parents of the novices and acquaintances were invited and witnessed the celebration.

#### A stage of formation with others

The current novitiate in Kinshasa is part of the Marie-Louise community which is already the pre-novitiate. We find there: three Daughters of Wisdom, 6 1st year pre-novices, 4 2nd year pre-novices, 4 novices and 3 aspirants at the "Come and see" stage. Despite these different stages of formation, the novices have their own little house, with an oratory well suited for their time of silence as well as a room suited both as a refectory and classroom. This requires an exercise in organization, which is not always easy to follow but which we live with joy, courage and determination. As novices, it makes us experience simplicity and adaptability to circumstances.

I thank the General Council for the guidance it has given to the formation of novices in the Entities and I thank you for its support and for its trust. I am grateful to the Council of the Delegation of Congo, who welcomed us with joy and who accompanies us in this beginning of formation of the novices upon the return of the novitiate stage to the Entities.

There is a good mutual support and collaboration with the sisters in the community; we follow the compass of Wisdom in our daily realities to recognize the signs that Wisdom is giving us at this time in our history as a Congregation. # Small Secret Calls

My name is Sr Teresa of the Sacred Heart, Daughter of Wisdom, born Ghislaine Pierre-Antoine, September 30th , 1930 in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. I made my religious profession sixty-five years ago and taught for 69 years.

I have been in a nursing home since 2019 after a fall. As I had wished to stay as long as possible in teaching to make Christ known and loved, to educate, to teach in the footsteps of our Mother Marie-Louise, my wish was fulfilled. I stayed at the school until the age of 89, sometimes as a classroom teacher, sometimes as a school Principal.

Let me describe a first experience from the age of nine. In 1939, the Good Lord called to Himself one of my cousins. Her mother, sitting near the coffin, kept repeating: "And to think that my daughter was going to become a nun!" I thought: "Religious life is a good thing; I will replace her." (First secret call).



Four years later, the teacher asked to write a great joy that will come to us in the future. My heart resonated. (Second secret call). Two years later, another teacher asked me if I was attracted to religious life. My spontaneous response was a "no", whereas that day, for me, was a confirmation of the call. My heart vibrated even harder.

From then on, I went to mass every morning in order to watch the DW Sisters. It was for me a real pleasure to see them walking in the street as I contemplated their collected attitude and their costume different from that of the world. Everything revealed God to me. Without saying a word to them, I went to see the Chaplain to tell him about my vocation. I never stopped thanking the Lord for choosing me as his bride. It is for me, a great joy every time.

In my life as a Daughter of Wisdom, I discovered that the "I" must always be in second place. As Father de Montfort said, Jesus must always be first. This is what I try to live and communicate to the younger members of our religious family.
